Delhi gets a new power sub-station

NEW DELHI: Chief Minister Sheila Dikshit inaugurated a 33 kV electric sub-station at Raisina Road here on Tuesday.

The sub-station has been commissioned as part of the New Delhi Municipal Council's electric system strengthening and up-gradation work. PGCIL was the turnkey consultant for this project that has been executed by Larsen and Toubro, said an NDMC official.

The sub-station has been completed in 18 months at a cost of Rs.11.5 crore.

Constructed over 1,500 sq.

meter, it has a dedicated rain-water harvesting system within the compound. The sub-station has a state-of-the-art indoor 33 kV gas-insulated switchgear system.

NDMC officials said the electric sub-station will ensure uninterrupted electricity supply to the areas of Krishi Bhawan, Shashtri Bhawan, Rail Bhawan, Jawahar Bhawan, Vayu Bhawan, Jawahar Lal Bhawan, Rajendra Prasad Road, K.G.Marg, Harish Chander Mathur Lane, Rafi Marg, National Archives of India, Jawahar Vyapar Bhawan, Janpath, Yojana Bhawan, Kerala House and Jeevan Vihar.
